Environmentally Friendly in the Shop

Spring is that time of year we think of 'spring cleaning'. But spring cleaning isn't just for the house. Here's a few environmentally friendly ideas for the shop:

1. Unplug chargers on power tools you don't use very often. Most cordless tools have nickel cadmium batteries which hold some charge up to a year—it's easy to just plug it in a few hours before you need it to power up again.
2. Dampen superfine sawdust shavings from the dust collection system & push them around to sweep concrete floors.
3. Save used paint thinner after cleaning oil-based brushes. Let it sit overnight. The sludge settles to the bottom. The next day put the clear thinner in a clean jar, cover and use again.

Every year elections are held in June. Positions are then held for 1 year (July to June).


