February Program Review: Paul Jensen , PJ's Woods / Jensen Originals

As Paul said "the wood tells him what to do"

Paul has a business designing and building unique kitchen utensils and other functional items designed to take advantage of unique grain patterns in exotic wood and burls. Paul also takes commissions for items which would have unique significance as gifts with the wood coloring, grain pattern and shapes taking on a personal meaning to the recipient.

The bowl and spoon sets he builds have provisions including concealed rare earth magnets and built in dowel and sockets which allow them to be assembled together as an art object suitable as a centerpiece to display on a buffet or mantle.

Paul gave us some hints on technique and details included in the items:

- Rare earth magnets available from K&J magnets
- Finish items suitable for food contact with Mineral Oil which is available at any drug store. The least expensive mineral oil would be available from pet supply sources.
- Paul recommends the best wood (to carve) for beginners is cherry
- Baking powder is useful to remove food odor from wooden utensils

Paul has just about every wood removing tool available including chain saw grinder wheels, carbide grit grinder wheels, Forstner bits, band saw, and lots of sanding!

Carl LaBelle, One of our Founders Passes Away

He showed a 16 inch platter of maple and walnut consisting of more than 1600 individual elements at a Guild meeting. It was spectacular and inspiring. At one of the first shows in which I participated, Carl brought his incredibly beautiful handmade seven foot workbench. It was without blemish even though he used it constantly.

Carl remained an active member until he suffered a stroke and was unable to continue his woodworking. After he became confined to a wheel chair, one of his daughters brought Carl to our annual spring shows until he became confined to a nursing care facility. Carl was always willing to share his knowledge and was always cheerful and friendly with a pleasant smile. I know that Jane and I will miss him and remember him as a truly fine woodworker and person.


Wanted: Old Woodworking Magazines and/or Catalogues

Tool Crib—Spring Show

For Guild members who wish to place items in the Tool Crib, below are the Tool Crib rules:

1. What is the tool crib?

Guild members can bring in new or old tools that they no longer want or need. Only members of the guild may sell tools in the tool crib. Also, members can donate a tool or tools to the guild. The guild will sell them at the tool crib and apply the proceeds to offset the cost of the spring show.

2. Have you notified the Spring Show Chairman (Jane Alesch) that you have items for the tool crib?

Provide Jane Alesch with a list of the **number of items** you wish to sell. Jane's phone number: **920-468-0132** or email her at jbalesch@att.net

3. How do I put tools in the tool crib?

You will be given a tag for each tool that you bring. On each tag you will fill out the following information: **Name/Phone Nbr:** (please use your cell phone number) **Tool:** (type of tool) **Condition:** (new, used, excellent, good, working, not working, etc.) **Price:** (what you want for the tool) Attach the tag to the tool. The tool tag must then be entered on to the numbered **Tool Crib Inventory** sheet. The **line number** on the inventory sheet **must be written on the tag.**

4. Do I have to be present to sell items in the tool crib?

Yes, you have to be present to sell items. You may designate someone else but either you or your designated representative must be at the show.

5. What is the selling procedure?

All sales are between the seller and buyer. When a buyer is interested in an item they can call the phone number on the tag or ask the worker at the tool crib where the seller is. Once the seller and buyer have reached an agreement, the seller will give the tag to the worker at the tool crib table. The worker will take the tag; write out a sales receipt and cross off the item on the Tool Crib Inventory sheet. All sold tools must have a receipt. **All sales are between the seller and buyer. The Guild will not handle any money.**

6. Can I bring in more items on Sunday? Yes, you may bring in additional items on Sunday.

7. What happens to the items at the end of the show?

All unsold items must be picked up by the seller by the end of the show. The guild will not be responsible for any items not picked up.

Tom will bring a box of Tool Crib tags to the February 21st program to make them available for anyone who is interested. Each member is limited to a maximum of 10 tags at one time. More tags will be available at the Tool Crib during the Spring Show.


and retrieve it. **Note:** The show closes at 5:00PM on Sunday, NOT at 4 when the raffle starts!!!! Thank You.


