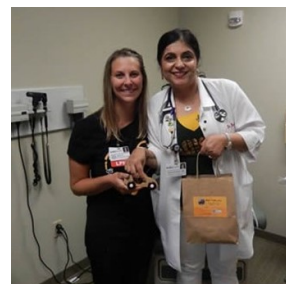

Pat will do a demonstration on realistic painting. Whether you are painting a carving, or on a flat surface, the principles are the same. She will teach you about: growth direction, shading,

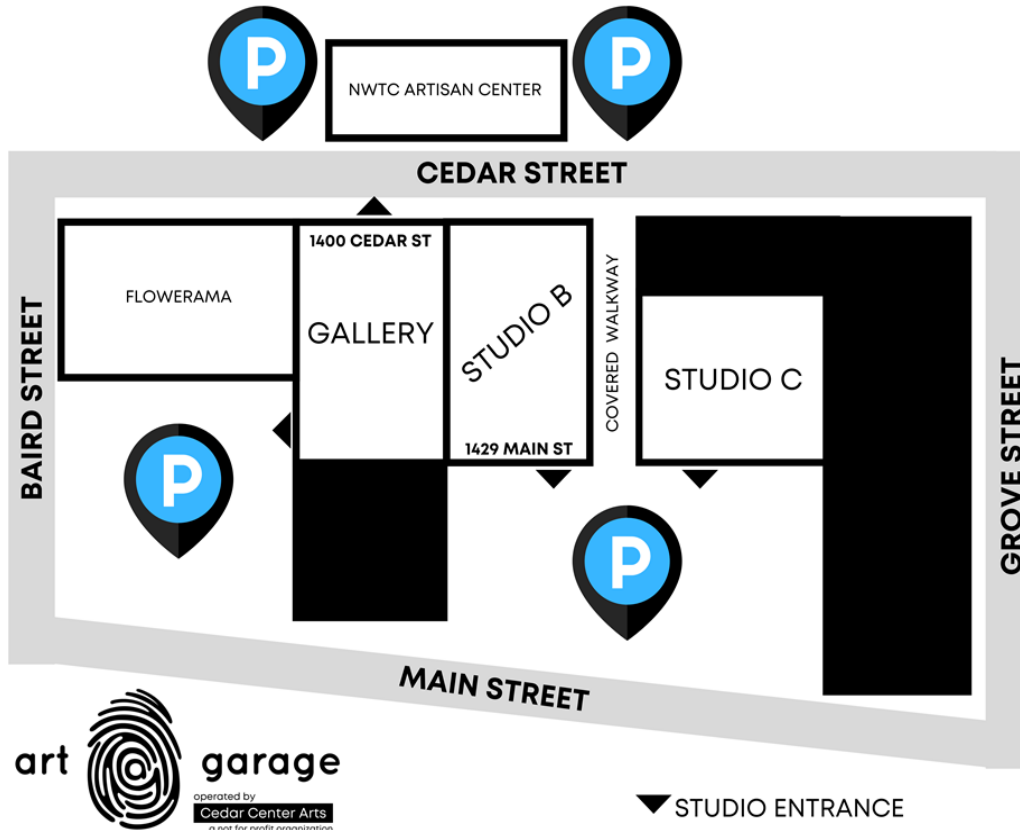
painting the eye, and painting feathers, along with how to highlight, all of which give you realism. All of these techniques are important in any carving, and can be applied to birds, animals, fish, flowers and humans.

Judges at shows look for detail and realism. Come to the April meeting and learn how to set your work apart from the average.

Membership Notices

Business Memberships are available and encouraged. Here are the guidelines for a business membership.

Woodworkers Guild Business Membership Category

Guild Business Members are vendors of woodworking tools, and supplies generally used by home and/or commercial woodworkers. Guild Business membership is encouraged.

Business Member's dues are \$35 annually after the member initial payment of \$50 which includes two name tags. Business Members may participate in the Guild as officers.

Guild Business members are allowed 2 voting members and may hold appointed or elective offices in the Guild.

Guild Business members wishing to present a woodworking related program at a regular meeting will need to work with the Guild program chairman to arrange a date and program topic.

Guild Business members may participate in the annual Woodworking Show with items for sale, presentations or demonstrations of woodworking related tools, techniques or products.

Guild Business members are encouraged to submit articles for Monthly Benchtalk newsletter that educates Guild members about aspects of woodworking. The maximum space available to each Business member is One-half Bench talk sheet per month.

Guild Business members may publish advertisements in Bench Talk offering promotions to woodworkers. The advertisement is not to exceed one fourth of a page.


