The Fragile State of our Show/Guild

Our Club has been in existence for 40 years. Lyle Martens along with a few like minded individuals started the Northeast Wisconsin Woodworkers Guild so woodworkers of all skill levels could learn and share with each other their love of woodworking.

Our Guild is no different than other similar organizations. We are struggling to find volunteers to help with the show or serve on the board of directors. At the June meeting, when the subject of positions on the board came up, it looked like most in attendance were looking for a rock to crawl under rather than ask or inquire about the positions on the board. We were lucky that those members were willing to keep their duties for another year.

Our members can get many benefits from being in the guild. They have access to perhaps the largest library dedicated to woodworking. Tons of books, videos and a few plans. They can attend as many or as few meetings as they like. There are guest presenters who talk about a variety of topics. Many are very talented and full of expertise. There is also problem solving and sources shared amongst fellow members. Then there is fraternalism. This includes the August Picnic, The Christmas Party in December and The Annual Show.

Let's talk about that last one, The Annual Show. That is the heartbeat of this organization. It is what makes all of what was previously stated possible. It is our chief source of revenue to pay for presenters at our meetings, do the guild picnic and Christmas Party, pay the rent on the place where we hold our meetings, costs affiliated with running the show itself (advertising, cost of the venue, table rentals, wrist bands, tickets, and so forth).

This cannot happen without help. We have members who do more than their share to make it happen But, they are not going to be around forever and maybe someday some of them may have had enough. We have members who are members in name only. They show up for the benefits of the guild but are nowhere to be found when we ask for 2 hours of help at our annual show. Other clubs charge admission to their show to members who DO NOT sign up to help with the event. The people that display, coordinate the event, or sign on to help get in free. The other members pay the price of admission.

We need helpers! We are not asking people to be there 2 whole days We have around 160 members. All we are asking is 2 hours of your time once during the year. This would be an enormous help.

Some of you may say, "Well I paid my \$15 dues!". Our dues have not been changed in eons. Similar clubs to the NEWWG pay \$45 a year. Our show has kept our dues where they are at.

Our show hangs in the balance of our members. If we don't get participation, it could fold. You don't have to look far to see that it is happening. The Wisconsin River Woodcarvers Inc. held their last show in Stevens Point last September. It was one of the largest carving shows in the state. Their largest show had 154 tables. They announced they were no longer doing it in October because they could not get enough help within the club.

A similar case happened in Ohio with the largest carving show in the country. They also could not get enough volunteers to make it work, so it folded.

Don't make the Northeast Wisconsin Woodworkers Show a distant memory. Volunteer some of your time! Do your part to make it thrive so people can enjoy the art of woodworking! All we ask is a couple of hours of your time once a year to make this work! If you are a member and are not displaying at the show or involved in the planning, we are reaching out to you.
