Wood Veneer for Sale

Seller: Ron Gast

Hello I am contacting you as to whether you would have any members that would be interested in purchasing wood veneer. I have a large quantity for sale

Wood Sheet Veneer - \$1/ sheet (Clintonville, WI)

Thickness checked at random and ranges between .025"-.030"

Sizes approx. 7'6" x 40"

8'3" x 40"

8'6" x 40"

Slice cut, No adhesive back, large quantity available. \$1.00/Sheet

Veneer in flat stacks but will need to be conditioned and flattened prior to use.

Due to the risk of damaging veneer, I will not dig thru stack for a small quantity of a specific variety, if near top will sell smaller quantities. Since I do not have sufficient space to segregate varieties in separate piles I would like to suggest if there is enough interest members could state the variety and quantity they want and two or three members could come with an adequate trailer and pick up for all, that way the required number of sheets and varieties could be loaded on trailer and grouped according to variety minimizing damage due to handling.

To the best of my knowledge these are the various varieties, Red Alder, Ash, Birch, Cherry, Maple, Red Oak, White Oak, and Mahogany individuals should when making out the list of varieties they want should also indicate alternate options if variety of 1st choice is not available, or indicate no substitutions allowed if not available.

I would also suggest a trailer with removable sides and bringing at a minimum 2 sheets of 4x8 plywood to sandwich veneer between and ratchet straps to secure, and picked up before cold weather.
