My 83 year old brother in law —Doug Payne, a serious duck carver—died last month and we have "inherited" a ton (?) of basswood and other carving woods and a semi-trailer shop full of all his wood carving power tools, including a highly specialized "copy lathe" (?) and all the other usual power tools (joiner, planer, drill press, sliding miter saw, vertical and horizontal sanders, air compressors, etc. — along with dozens/hundreds (?) of half-carved ducks (produced by that specialized lathe?). The wood is stacked 4 feet high, 6 to 8 feet long, on covered pallets in back of the trailer he lived in, and the ends are badly weathered and the planks would need to be planed but essentially is still fine. I'm 86—too old to start a new hobby—and Doug's landlord is anxious for us to get this wood and tools off the property (located in a rural area of Junction City), so we're open to any offers, ideas, advice, suggestions for disposing of Doug's wood and tools ASAP.
